

Frederick J. (Fritz) Roegge Vice Admiral, United States Navy (retired)

President, Holtec Government Services and Senior Vice President and Chief Strategy Officer, Holtec International

Fritz Roegge joined Holtec International in 2021 as President of Holtec Government Services. He also serves as the Senior Vice President and Chief Strategy Officer of Holtec International – a billion-dollar technology and manufacturing innovation company supporting the Department of Defense, the Department of Energy, and clean energy industries that has been "A Generation Ahead by Design" since 1986.

A career submarine officer, Fritz has led organizations of progressively increasing size, budget, and complexity ranging from command of a single nuclear-powered submarine to command of the entire US Pacific Submarine Force – an enterprise of 40 submarines, 12,000 people, \$160B capital assets, and \$560M budget distributed across six states/territories, partner nations, and twelve time zones. His military career culminated as a three-star Admiral as President of the National Defense University.

His experience also includes service as technical assistant to the Director of the Navy Nuclear Propulsion Program; Secretary of the Navy legislative liaison to the US House of Representatives; director of personnel policy and diversity, equity, and inclusion initiatives for 385,000 Navy personnel; and significant senior responsibilities outside of the Navy with joint (i.e., all-service) and coalition (i.e., international) organizations.

Fritz serves as a Director on the Boards of (1) Oak Ridge Technologies, a Small Business Administration Mentor-Protégé joint venture of Holtec International and Gilmartin Engineering supporting US government customers; (2) CVN Dismantlement Partners LLC, a joint venture of Holtec Government Services and APTIM Federal Services formed to compete for the dismantlement and disposal of the Ex-ENTERPRISE aircraft carrier; and (3) Homecoming 250 Navy Marine Corps, a 501(c)3 non-profit coordinating with the Navy and Marine Corps for these Services' 250th birthday celebrations in the Delaware River Valley in 2025.

He has also served as a Board Member of the United States Institute of Peace, Washington, DC and of the Consortium of Universities of the Washington Metropolitan Area, Washington DC; and as a member of the Council on Competitiveness' University Leadership Forum, Washington, DC.

Fritz is an honors graduate of the University of Minnesota with a Bachelor of Science in Mechanical Engineering; he earned a Master of Science in Engineering Management from the Catholic University of America and a Master of Arts with highest distinction in National Security and Strategic Studies from the Naval War College.

He was a fellow of the Massachusetts Institute of Technology Seminar XXI program for national security leaders and of the Harvard University Kennedy School National Security Executive Program. He has also benefitted from executive education programs at the Center for Creative Leadership, Colorado Springs CO; the Naval Postgraduate School, Monterey CA; and the University of Virginia Darden School, Charlottesville VA.
