Brad Smith has served as President and General Manager of Newport News Nuclear BWXT Los Alamos (N3B) since 2023.

Brad has been with N3B on and off since January 2020, serving most recently as N3B's Acting Executive Officer. Previously at N3B, Mr. Smith served as the Engineering & Nuclear Safety (E&NS) program manager and as the acting Environmental Remediation (ER) program manager. Between those assignments, Brad supported N3B in several capacities as a corporate reach-back employee from Huntington Ingalls Industries (HII).

In those previous position, Brad helped resolve N3B's safety basis challenges and led the ER Program through the COVID-19 pandemic while meeting all Consent Order milestones agreed upon by U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) and the New Mexico Environment Department. He played a crucial role in overseeing the Situation Room during N3B's stop work order, when senior management and project management teams reviewed and revised processes and procedures to improve employee safety.

Brad has more than three decades of senior project and program management experience in large, complex nuclear and chemical operations, including work related to startup, remediation, decontamination and decommissioning. This includes more than 20 years managing domestic DOE projects and six years with international projects.

N3B is a limited liability company owned by Huntington Ingalls Nuclear (a subsidiary of Huntington Ingalls Industries) and BWX Technologies. N3B manages the Los Alamos Legacy Cleanup Contract for the U.S. Department of Energy's Environmental Management Los Alamos Field Office.
