EFCOG Spring 2014

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Event Description

- Physical security was informed of an issue with converters.
 - Inadequate foaming left the potential for revealing internals (confidential restricted data).
- Four Converters were initially found.
- Extent of condition located nineteen others.
 - Population was from 180-200 units.
- Of the nineteen, fourteen had the potential to reveal internals.

Issue Description (Continued)

- Units weighed approximately 12000 pounds.
- Staged in a manner to prevent physical and visual access.
- Due to staging arrangements, walk-downs did not allow physical inspection.
- Units were moved using heavy equipment when uncleared personnel were in the area.
- Movement had caused foam to shaken or knocked loose.

Interview Process

- Fellow contractor performed the investigation.
- Both phone and face-to-face interviews were conducted.
- Fully admitted that this was a common occurrence.
- Investigation did not indicate that one individual was responsible.
- Root Cause was found to be non-compliance with Security procedure.

Office of Enforcement (OE) Concerns

- Access to confidential restricted data.
- "Noncompliant conditions existed for several weeks before UCOR project management reported the deficiencies to the UCOR security organization."
 - Situation was immediately alleviated.
- "UCOR's slow response to these known noncompliant conditions contributed to the potential for uncleared workers to gain unauthorized access to classified information."
 - Only access possible was using a cleared operator and heavy equipment.

Issues

- Fellow contractor reported issue to database.
- UCOR was unaware of this reporting.
- DOE-ORO PAAA Coordinator was unaware of OE actions.
- DOE-ORO Security group was aware but did not communicate.
- Whilst at EFCOG, OE personnel call and inform of the letter.
 - Spelled my name incorrectly.
- Spent a day and a half responding.
- Two weeks of follow-up activity.
