Supporting DOE sites with occupational health and safety training of workers on the:


- Handling of hazardous materials and waste

Authorized by National Defense Authorization Act: Section 3131 (FY 1992) and implemented through an Interagency Agreement with DOE Office of Environmental Management (EM)

Workers prepared for all hazards across the DOE complex


Site-specific delivery of courses

The NIEHS/DOE Nuclear Worker Training Program provides health and safety training for workers within the DOE nuclear weapons complex.

The program is a partnership between the NIEHS Worker Training Program (WTP) and the DOE Office of Environmental Management to provide grants for nonprofit organizations, or grantees, to deliver fundamental and site-specific health and safety training to DOE workers

WTP grantees deliver training to DOE workers involved in any nuclear. weapons related activities. Training includes fundamental and advanced hazard-specific training and is provided through local partnerships between the government, contractors, and program grantees. Preemployment training can also be provided, which improves project mobilization and reduces costs.

#### Course Curricula and Delivery

Course delivery is available for topics related to occupational safety and health, such as personal protective equipment, hazard communication.

Course curricula and training materials are developed by professionals with a systematic approach, building on an analysis of needs, curriculum design, and evaluation. Adult learning methods are the bedrock of WTP grantee training, with hands-on skills development and technologies that

The development, maintenance, and delivery of course curricula are funded by NIEHS/DOE Nuclear Worker Training Program grants. In some situations, collaborative agreements allow WTP grantee instructors to use DOE contractor training materials.



# **Safety Culture for Workers**

Three courses developed through supplemental funding

    - This is now DOE's TLP-100
- Course from International Association of Firefighters
  - Frontline Safety for DOE, 8 hrs

#### The process

Site contractor provides Ted a description of your training needs

NIEHS matches site training needs with grantee training capabilities and geography

Collaboratively develop an initial schedule

Collaboratively work through logistics, such as:

- Finding and approving trainers
- Curricula decisions and needs


